PARINGA IN A CLASS OF ITS OWN!

Paringa Estate Winery was established in 1985 at Red Hill in the very heart of the Mornington Peninsula by ex-schoolteacher, Lindsay McCall and his wife, Margaret. The original home property had 4.2 hectares of vines and the current winery and top-rating restaurant were built in 1998 on the same site as the original smaller winery. Since 2003, they have added a further 12.8 hectares of leased or managed vineyards which has substantially added to the Estate's premium fruit.

Such is Lindsay's reputation that James Halliday in the 2007 Halliday Wine Companion rates Paringa Estate as 5 stars. This rating has classified Paringa Estate as an "outstanding winery regularly producing exemplary wines"

In fact, it was awarded by James the honour of being named Winery of the Year. But James Halliday is not alone when handing out accolades for Lindsay and his wines. Most other scribes are full of praise for the range of wines which cover riesling, chardonnay, pinot noir, and in a testament to Lindsay's skill, he is one of the only wine-makers who can consistently produce top grade shiraz from this cool climate region. In fact, the Paringa Estate Shiraz 2004 amassed a staggering 6 Trophies across 6 classes at the 2006 Sydney Royal Wine Show. That is a monumental achievement.

Paringa continued from front

Lindsay produces wines in three distinct grades. The entry level Peninsula Series are fruit driven with genuine varietal characteristics made for current drinking or short term cellaring. The Estate Series uses fruit from their low-yielding 15 to 20 year old estate vines with between 30% and 50% new French oak being used to produce the unique Paringa style as Lindsay's "flagship wine". Cellar for up to 6 years.

Finally, are **miniscule quantities of the best wine they can produce** – but only in vintages when the fruit has reached a required level of excellence. These are the Paringa Reserve Series which have been produced in 2000, 2003 and 2004 only, and these wines will reward careful cellaring for 6-10 years. We are able to offer the following wines, but a word of caution. Some stocks are LIMITED.

Paringa Estate Reserve Special Barrel Selection Shiraz 2003

95 points James Halliday

A complex and layered array of black cherry, licorice and spice; fine tannins. Till 2015

Paringa Estate Reserve Special Barrel Selection Shiraz 2004

96 points James Halliday

Medium-to-full bodied; concentrated rich, peppery, spicy fruits more to black than red; seamless oak and tannins. Till 2024

Paringa Estate Shiraz 2004

96 points James Halliday

Winner of 6 Trophies at the Sydney Wine Show 2006, including Best wine of Show. Limited.

Paringa Estate Reserve Special Barrel Selection Pinot Noir 2004

96 points James Halliday

Shows all the characteristics of Paringa, but with an extra degree of intensity & length; outstanding wine. Till 2012

Paringa Estate Chardonnay 2003

92 points James Halliday

100% barrel-fermented in French oak, 20% new. The elegant moderately intense grapefruit and melon palate is perfectly balanced, the fruit having eaten all the oak. Till 2012

Paringa Estate Pinot Noir 2005 –

Just released. Not yet rated by Halliday.

Excellent wine, with great perfume and balance. Needs a bit more time in bottle to flesh out, but will be a great Pinot.

Paringa Estate PE Pinot Noir 2005

94 points James Halliday

Youthful, bright purple red; vibrant plum and cherry character with touches of stem & oak; silky mouthfeel, will develop very well. Till 2012

STONIER INTERNATIONAL PINOT NOIR TASTING

(THE BIG SURPRISE WAS THE BARGAINS)

On Monday July 31st, I ventured along with Phil Smith to the Sofitel Hotel in Melbourne, where the seventh Annual SIPNOT was being conducted. Along with about 200 other "pinot-philés" and a distinguished panel of experts and a visiting high-profile UK wine writer, Matthew Jukes, we gazed at, sniffed and slurped our way through a diverse collection of Californian, New Zealand, Oregon, Australian and French examples of this most beguiling and temperamental grape variety. Needless, to say, the wines were served masked, and there were a number of surprises revealed.

The distinguished panel comprised -

Brian Croser AO, founder of Petaluma Vineyard in 1976, veteran Chairman of wine judging panels in Adelaide, Canberra and Sydney.

Len Evans, AO OBE, journalist, vineyard owner, wine judge and industry luminary.

James Halliday, lawyer, founder of Coldstream Hills winery, senior wine judge and Australia's most influential wine writer.

Geraldine McFaul, Stonier winemaker, and a veteran of over 10 vintages in Australia and Burgundy.

The wines were tasted in 2 brackets of 6 with a panel review at after each flight. The wines, in order of tasting with approximate retail value were:

Members of the panel went to great lengths to explain that comparing an 04 New World pinot to an 03 Grand Cru Burgundy would generally be classed as a mismatch, because the Burgundy will normally be sleeping in a cellar for 15-20 years before drinking at close to its optimum level. However, the exercise here was to consider the texture, balance and structure of each wine before making a decision. Mind you, the 2003 vintage in Burgundy was extremely hot, and challenged even the finest winemakers.

In the first flight, the panel chose Paringa, followed by Curly Flat and Kupe although there was strong support from the floor for a slightly sulphidic Siduri. **One member of the audience had the audacity to challenge the findings of the panel and the Chairman, Len Evans "put him away"** in quite brutal fashion by suggesting that he needed to "taste a few wines".

There was a marked lift in quality overall in the second flight, and the panel overwhelmingly selected Bannockburn with Armand Rousseau and Argyle showing well also. This reflected the views of the audience, and as far as the Wine of the Night went, in a show of hands, the Bannockburn edged out Armand Rousseau for top wine.

All in all, a great night and the obvious conclusion to be drawn was that the gap between the best of Burgundy and the New World (Victoria in particular) is narrowing.

Following the surprise result at the Sydney SIPNOT in 2005 where Stonier Reserve 03 "scooped the pool", the Stonier KBS Vineyard again made a strong showing and attracted

a great deal of support. I suppose the greatest thrill for a pinot lover was to find that two of the most acclaimed wines of the night were also two of the least expensive. The Curly Flat at around \$44 and Bannockburn around \$50 were both great examples of well-made and enjoyable pinot noir.

Georg Breuer Rudesheim riesling 05

The Georg Breuer Estate cultivates 30ha of vines in the Rheingau region of Germany. 23ha of this is from the Rudesheim village. The high slate content of the soil is reflected in this wine which offers a lot of minerality along with peaches and apricot. The palate is dry and powerful but also has finesse. The acidity is high but balanced. Will look great with age and really needs to be paired with food.

Chateau Coupe Roses Minervois 04

Minervois is a sub-region of the Languedoc in Southern France; it is not a well known region but has a reputation for good reds. We have two great wines from one of the more quirky producers. "La Bastide" is a blend of old vine grenache and carignan it's characters are marked by strong floral and herbal (but not green) aromas and underneath we have dark cherries, spice and a palate that has a firm grip and densely packed fruit.

"Les Plots" is a blend of syrah and grenache with a little carignan. This wine has less (but still shows some) of the floral characters, but shows a strong savoury, earthy bent. This is a step up in complexity and structure, more reminiscent of a Southern Rhone blend.

Michel Gonet Champagne

These wines are 100% estate grown and vinified. They have 40ha of vineyards including parcels in Grand Cru Villages Avize, Mesnil and Oger. The majority of the production uses chardonnay including three Grand Cru Blanc de Blanc wines. The entire range is good, and includes a well priced, complex Reserve NV and Blanc de Blanc NV, but the standouts are their Blanc de Blanc Grand Cru 2001 and their Blanc de Blanc Cuvee Prestige Grand Cru 1996.

The former is lean, tight and mid-weight with very crisp minerally acidity. The characters show youthful fruit of lemon and melon, with a high minerality and chalkiness, lanolin and savoury lees. A very refreshing style that will fill out and become more complex with time in bottle. The latter is very pure and focused, with a light to mid-weight palate and with noticeable acidity but less piercing than the '01. This wine shows characters of grapefruit, gun flint, nutty autolytic notes and much more but does not show any signs of over-development. This is a very good example of the fantastic 96 vintage.

Alain Graillot Crozes-Hermitage Rouge 04

Crozes is a large appellation in Northern Rhone, this leads to a great diversity in soils, climate, wines styles and personalities. Alain Graillot is one of the few producers who are 100% quality focused and consistently good.

In this issue we are featuring his awe inspiring Rouge. The wine is whole bunch fermented in concrete vats following a cold maceration, using natural yeasts and no added sulphur. A three week vinification with pumping over twice a day after which the wine spends around a year in large oak, only 5-10% of which is new. There is good depth with blackberry, smoke and mineral notes, nice flesh and a long, spicy finish. Racy, and refusing to be spat out, it will benefit from a year or two in the cellar.

Redoak

Clarence Street Sydney doesn't sound like a place to find some of the best Australian beers.

But the people at Redoak are making a range of sophisticated 'speciality' beers, at least as complex as some of the wines we sell. We are now selling two of their beers.

First, we have the Vienna Lager, a style unsurprisingly, originating around Vienna, and offering a deeper, almost mahogany, colour than your average lager. The flavours robust, showing lots of rich malt, and in the mouth it's quite full and round, but not as weighty as an ale, with a lovely clean bitterness. This beer will match gourmet sausages or grilled veal.

The second one is the Belgium Chocolate Stout. This is quite an experience; they take their standard Oatmeal Stout and infuse a percentage of real Belgium chocolate. The outcome is rich, thick and velvety and offers flavours of bitter and sweet chocolate, burnt grains and a lot more. Naturally this beer will match chocolate or chocolate based dishes, but it's very drinkable on its own.

VALE JOHN MIDDLETON

On Tuesday 26th July, Dr John Middleton passed away following an illness.

In the 1960's, John and a group of Yarra Valley medicos became interested in wine.

John began his Mount Mary Vineyard in 1971 at Coldstream. His passion was to replicate,

as much as possible, the wines of Bordeaux and Burgundy. He subsequently became an icon in the Australian wine industry, and despite his aversion to most retailers and a sometimes prickly disposition, he encouraged me to appreciate and then sell his wonderful wines. One of the joys during this time was the annual pilgrimage to Mount Mary in early December to sample the new releases.

His wines were not the "full on" 16% style of which he was very critical. His were the more subtle, seductive French food-friendly styles. Judging by the demand for his product in here and overseas, he succeeded admirably. We have lost a wonderful friend and the world is certainly the poorer for his passing.

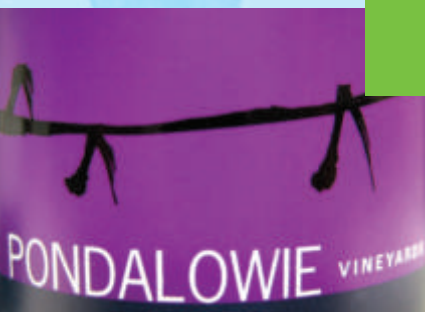
Leconfield cabernet sauvignon 04

After quite a few years in the wilderness Leconfield have come back into form and have made a beautifully crafted, elegant Coonawarra cab. Showing classic characters of cassis, tart red berries, mint and a bit of leafiness. The well defined fruit is surrounded by firm tannins and propped up by good acidity. This is a wine with a good future. *Ageing – give it 5+*

Pondalowie shiraz viognier 04

Ok, so we did mention this wine in the last newsletter but its really, really good! You don't have to take our word for it though, James Halliday scored it 95points, and it has won a Gold medal at the London International Wine Challenge. The wine itself is dense, brooding and complex. Great value too! *Ageing – It is looking great now, but I'd love to see it in 10 years too.*

TOP PICK



Torbreck Struie shiraz 04

A blend of Barossa and Eden Valley fruit, the Struie is basket pressed and aged in a mixture of new and old oak. The idea is to make expressive wines not over-ripe, over-extracted monsters. The team at Torbreck got it all right. It's complex with cassis, violets, white pepper and savoury almost truffle note and hints of smoke and game. The palate is long and silky with good tannin that keeps everything neat. *Ageing – Will repay 5-8 years of patiences.*

Heartland shiraz 05

Made by Ben Glaetzer of Glaetzer Wines fame. This shiraz from the Langhorne Creek and Limestone coast is the epitome of "glugable". It has lively aromas of roses, cherries, raspberries and a whole lot more. Rich and juicy palate with ripe red berries, spice. Perfect to match "the before the weather gets too hot" roasts and casseroles of the year *Ageing – You won't keep your hands off it.*

Lashmar sister blend 03

The sisters blend consists of cabernet, shiraz and merlot, that has been aged in oak for 20 months. When we tried the wine with the winemaker Colin Cooter (from Lengs & Cooter) it was sensational and could sell for around \$30 mark. When we heard we could do it for \$22 we ordered some on the spot. The blend offers juicy red berries, dried spices, subtle with integrated oak and a lovely long palate. Great for all sorts of meat based dishes. *Ageing – Ready now, but will go a few years.*



Curly Flat chardonnay 04

The Macedon wine region certainly offers some tricky conditions for people trying to grow good quality wine grapes, but places like Curly Flat do it well on a consistent basis. In great years, like 2004, they can produce world class wines. The chardonnay possesses Chablis like characters of high acid, light but powerful, long and complex palate and a very clean, fresh and vibrant nose. They also offer a great 2003 vintage pinot. Both wines will be on tasting on 7th October. *Ageing – Give it 5-10 for best results*

Rockford New Releases

Our favourite Barossa producer has released a few new wines, which will either are or shortly will be available. **Eden Valley Riesling 2004** – a super release of this exceptional Riesling that consistently over-delivers at the price. **Alicante Bouchet 2006** (stelvin) – Spring means the release of our biggest selling rose and easily the best qualified "cult rose" around. **Moppa Springs 2002** – a Grenache Mataro Shiraz blend showing delicious juicy Grenache fruit with soft mellow earthy notes. And finally the unsung hero of the Rockford white range – **Frontignac 2006** (stelvin). This wine is the undisputed king when it comes to Asian food, and believe it or not, it ages remarkably well too.



Trevor Jones Wild Witch shiraz 02

For many years Trevor Jones has been releasing some stunning, good value wines under his own name, and we really had to take note when James Halliday gave the Wild Witch 97 points. His notes read "similar to the standard release (intense, elegant, focused and very long in the mouth), except that the intensity is even more pronounced, the length likewise; an inherent elegance despite all the power; oak and tannins where they should be" *Ageing – 5 would be good but 10+ better.*

O'Leary Walker rieslings 06

This time every year we rave about Polish Hill and Watervale rieslings are. This year I'd say the 2006 wines, and the Watervale especially, are the best new release rieslings I've seen from Australia. The Watervale is tight with lean, taut acidity that promises long life. It has high minerality, candied citrus, some sweet spice and a chalky/phenolic backbone. An absolute baby. The Polish Hill is more lifted aromatically, with a note of fresh white flowers to go with citrus fruits and lemon blossom. The palate is a bit more giving too, with more fruit weight but still showing lovely acidity. *Ageing – Drink now and/or wait for 10+*



Longview Vineyard range.

The recent Longview releases have really impressed us for the quality and drinkability. We're stocking the 'Whippet' sauvignon blanc 05, 'Iron Knob' riesling and 'Black Crow' nebbiolo. The Whippet shows a dry, lean palate, zesty citrus & tropical fruit, plus hints of herbs straw and hay. A stunning example of cool-climate European style sauv. The riesling, made by the O'Leary Walker team, offers characters of lime, grapefruit and mandarin with a gun flint note. The palate is fuller and more textured than the classic Clare Valley style but the wines is still bone dry and offers great acidity. The nebbiolo is savoury with charcuterie-like notes with black cherry, earth, leather, tar, roses, and more. The palate has classic velvety fruit with firm, powerful tannins and high acid. *Ageing – Sauv blanc, drink now. Riesling, now to 5 years. Nebbiolo, leave for 5-10 years.*

Balgownie Estate wines 04

One of our most successful tastings ever was held in mid-August when Tobias Ansted, the Balgownie wine-maker released his 04 wines. The Estate was established in 1969 and wines were first made by the legendary Stuart Anderson. Tobias now has the brand firmly back on track after changes in the late '90's. These are dark brooding wines and at the price offered, cannot be ignored by wine enthusiasts. *Ageing- The shiraz for around 10 years, but the cabernet sauvignon will go much longer.*

Trentham Estate nebbiolo 03

Following on from the last newsletter where we raved about Italian nebbiolo we decided to give some Aussie examples a go. Trentham Estate's is definitely one of merit. The varietal characters are all there, cherries, tar, tobacco, roses, and myriad dry spices. The palate, while showing some of the neb tannin, is far softer and juicier than the Italian styles. *Ageing – Not necessary.*

Chicken and yoghurt curry

This is adapted from a Charmaine Soloman recipe out of 'The Complete Asian Cookbook'. I suspect most Australian food writers own this book and borrow from it frequently, without giving any credit!!

It is a lovely piquant curry that is a breeze to make. If I am pushed for time I just finely chop the onion and garlic and dispense with the blender.

2kg chicken drumsticks
1 chopped onion
3 cloves peeled garlic
2 tsp grated ginger
1/2 cup chopped mint and coriander
1 1/2 tablespoons oil
1 tsp garam masala
1 tsp ground turmeric
3/4 tsp salt
1/2 tsp chilli powder

1/2 cup non fat yoghurt
1/2 can diced tomatoes
1tsp sugar
Extra chopped coriander to garnish

Blend onion, garlic, ginger, coriander and mint to a puree. Heat oil in a saucepan and add the puree, turmeric, garam masala, salt and chilli and fry for about 5 minutes. Add tomatoes, sugar and yoghurt and fry till liquid dries up to a thick puree. Add chicken, coat with the mixture, cover tightly, turn heat to very low and cook till chicken is very tender (about 35-40 minutes. Remove chicken and reduce the sauce down if too runny. Serve with basmati rice.
